A reminder: Club Fee Increase in September: Fees will go up, being linked to CPI, and we will also need to include any SACA increase, due to them raising their fees with the introduction of their new system, Revsport. MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION TIME

Prior to our Annual General Meeting being held on

Thursday 21st August 2025 at 10:30 am

we need to identify and nominate members willing to undertake the following committee positions which will become vacant in August:

- President- 2-year position
- Vice President – 1 year position as currently vacant usually
- a 2-year position
- Treasurer- 2-year position
- AC Coordinator role- 2-year position
- 3 Committee members- 1-year positions.

The term of office for the office bearers shall be two years.

The President, Treasurer and AC Coordinator to retire in odd years.

The Vice-President, Secretary, GC Co-Ordinator to retire in even years.

The term for other Committee members to be one year.

Both office Bearers and Committee members are eligible to stand for re-election for a further term.

This is your opportunity to take a more active role in the running of the club and contribute new ideas and influence the future direction of the club over the coming years.

There is a noticeboard in the club house on the central bench with nomination forms for each role which need to be completed two weeks prior to the AGM.

Club Mallets- There has been discussion lately about the use of club mallets. These are used by new learners, visitors and those club members who have not yet bought a mallet. One of the considerations is maintenance. Some of the mallets are used each session and are showing wear and tear.

After consideration, the Management Committee has said that there is an expectation that members will purchase a mallet for their own use.

So- there will be some mallets reserved for learners and visitors and are not for general use.

There will also be some mallets available for purchase. Depending on the ease of use for you personally, they could need some alteration such as longer handles.

And there will be some mallets for use by club members, who do not yet have a mallet, for a contribution of \$1 per session, payable into the labeled container, set beside the Green Fees container on the desk. These mallets will be kept in shed 1.

If you are interested in purchasing a club mallet, catch up with Kate who will show you the selection and talk about customizing it for your use.

Member reminders:

- Shoes without deep grip soles are advisable on the courts, i.e, not hiking boots but flat soles where possible; particularly in wet weather, when grass is soft.
- When games are near the starting time, check to ensure the gate from the carpark is closed; no string holding it open allowing people to wander in.
- All members are welcome to play the 2nd, 3rd and a 4th games (weather permitting) if that better suits their personal time clocks.
- Since we have experienced good rains lately, special care of the lawns is requested. Thank you

To help your on-court play a few types of common faults set out below.... you may like to refresh your memory.

WORLD CROQUET FEDERATION (WCF) GOLF CROQUET (GC) RULES 6th EDITION

11.2 TYPES OF FAULT

Subject to Rule 11.3, a fault is committed by a player who, during the striking period:

11.2.1 touches the mallet head with a hand (but see Rule 11.3.2); or

11.2.2 strikes a ball by kicking, hitting, dropping or throwing the mallet; or

11.2.3 strikes a ball with any part of the mallet other than an end-face of the head, either deliberately in any stroke or accidentally in a stroke that requires special care because of the proximity of a hoop or the peg or another ball; or

11.2.4 strikes a ball with the mallet more than once, or allows a ball to retouch the mallet; or

11.2.5 maintains contact between the mallet and a ball; or

11.2.6 causes a ball, while still in contact with the mallet, to touch a hoop, the peg or, unless the balls were in contact before the stroke, another ball; or

11.2.7 strikes a ball when it lies in contact with a hoop upright or the peg other than away therefrom; or

11.2.8 touches any ball, other than the ball that the player intended to strike, with the mallet, or touches any ball with the player's body; or

11.2.9 moves or shakes a stationary ball by hitting a hoop or the peg with the mallet or the player's body; or

11.2.10 causes damage to the court surface inside the boundary with the mallet that, before the court surface is repaired, is capable of significantly affecting a subsequent stroke played over the damaged area.

11.3 DECLARATION OF FAULTS

11.3.1 A fault is to be declared if the player (or a referee or other observer asked to watch the stroke) believes that it is more likely than not that the relevant event occurred.

11.3.2 A fault under Rule 11.2.1 is committed only if the mallet head is touched during the final forward swing of the mallet.
